Baosi Banikanta Kakati College - A Profile

Baosi Banikanta Kakati College was established at Nagaon of greater Baosi locality on 25th July, 1971. This college came into existence as a result of the indefatigable effort of Late Mahendra Mohan Choudhury, a noted freedom fighter, former Chief Minister of Assam and former Governor of Punjab. Baosi was once a seat of diverse cultural and religious activities of Vaishnavite preacher Mahapurush Srimanta Shankardeva and his disciples Mahapurush Madhavdeva, Damodardeva and Harideva. Then in the late 19th century, Baosi was endowed with a worthy son of Assam Dr. Banikanta Kakati who was born at Batikuriha village of Baosi area. Dr. Kakati was a great scholar, linguist, literary critic and academician of repute. Thus, the name of the college Baosi Banikanta Kakati is conflation of “Baosi” and “Banikanta Kakati”- the historic place and the renowned person, to carry forward in its entirety, the past flare and present excellence.

Baosi Banikanta Kakati College is nestled amidst lush green paddy fields and sylvan serenity, 12 kms away from the din and bustle of the urban atmosphere of Barpeta town, and thus the college conforms to the ancient concept of Gurukulashram. Being basically a rural college, the academic needs of the local populace is given utmost importance. A healthy academic environment is the hallmark of this college. Since the inception, the college has been able to draw the attraction of the youth as a preferred destination of higher education in lower Assam.

Today, the college caters to the educational needs of over 1800 students in the faculties of Arts, Science and Computer science at the Higher Secondary, Under Graduate and Post Graduate level. In spite of having various hardship and limitations, effective and relevant steps have been taken for incorporating new inputs and techniques for ensuring quality education in rural setting. The problem of traditional mode of teaching-learning in COVID-19 pandemic situation has been addressed with online mode of education by developing permanent learner centric online interface. Moreover, outreach programmes and extension activities are undertaken for inclusive education and holistic development of students for an equitable society. The college has also incorporated some skill oriented courses. 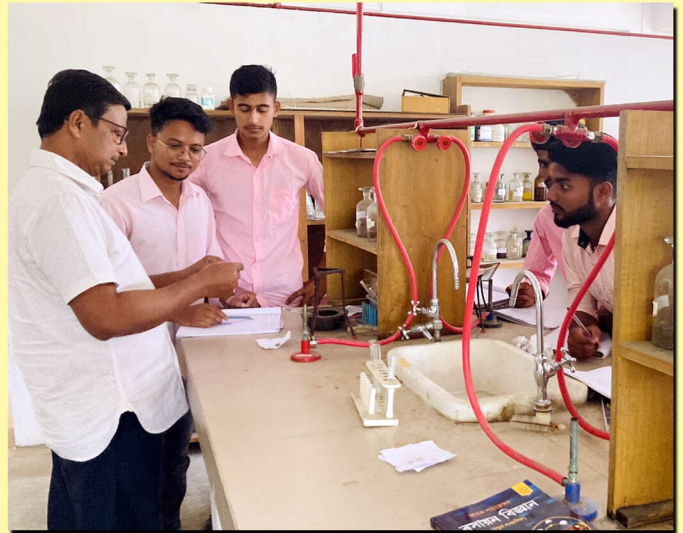

GENERAL INFORMATION

1. Course of Study :

- a) Higher Secondary courses in Arts and Science.
- b) Four Year Under Graduate Programme in Arts and Science shall be done as below.
 1. A Students who has passed 12th standard or equivalent examination in any stream from a recognized institution.
 2. Admission to the FYUGP will be based on the preference of Major, in any. In case student does not want to opt for any Major, s/ he will be admitted on the basis of preferences of the subject combinations.
 3. Admission to a Programme or Major will be subject to availability of the subject and capacity of a college/ department.
 4. No student shall be eligible for admission to a Programme in any discipline under the FYUGP unless s/ he fulfills the pre-requisites of courses as fixed by the university.
- c) Four Year Degree Course in Bachelor of Computer Application (BCA)
- d) One year Post Graduate Diploma (two semesters) in Computer Application (PGDCA)

2. Subjects offered in Higher Secondary Course :

Arts : Eligibility : H.S.L.C. or equivalent recognized examination.

Subjects : English, MIL (Assamese/ Alternative English/ Hindi), Economics, Education, Political Science, History, Logic & Philosophy, Arabic, Adv. Assamese, Anthropology

Science : Eligibility : H.S.L.C. or equivalent recognized examination.

Subjects : English, MIL (Assamese/ Alternative English/ Hindi), Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Biology.

Combination of subjects in H.S. Course :

A. Arts:

- (i) English & EVS is compulsory.
- (ii) A student must select one Modern Indian Language (Assamese/ Alternative English/ Hindi)
- (iii) A student must select three/ four elective subjects from the following list:
 - (a) Economics (b) Political Science (c) Logic & Philosophy
 - (d) Education (e) Anthropology
 - (f) History / Mathematics
 - (g) Adv. Assamese / Arabic

3. Programme and corricular components of FYUGP :

Overview and structure—

The complete FYUGP consists of 8 semester, to be completed in a minimum of 4 academic years. Each academic year has two semesters. Each semester has a maximum credit allocation of 22. All together the minimum credit requirements for a 3 year programme is 120 and 4 year programme, its 160.

ABC (Academic Bank of Credits)

The GU-FYUGP is directly connected to the ABC (Academic Bank of Credit) as notified by the UGC. All credits a student earn at the end of an examination in GU-FYUGP, will be deposited in the ABC by the university As such it is mandatory that a student under GU-FYUGP register for the ABC as notified by the regulatory agencies.

4. Subjects offered in Post Graduate Degree Course : Assamese

SELF FINANCED COURSES :

1. BCA Eligibility Minimum requirement for admission to the course is H.S. or equivalent examination in any stream. Student not from Science stream will have to take up a Bridge course in addition to the normal course in the 1st semester.
2. Post Graduate Diploma Course in Computer Application (PGDCA)
Course Duration : The duration of the course is one year consisting of two Semesters.
Eligibility : A student with a Bachelor Degree of 10+2+3 pattern in any discipline is eligible for the course, preferably students having Mathematics at the Higher Secondary level and obtaining minimum pass mark in the subject is eligible for admission. Candidates not having Mathematics at the Higher Secondary level will have to pursue a Bridge course.
3. Courses under Distance mode
The college has introduced various courses under Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University (KKHSOU) from the session 2022-23.
4. Post Graduate Course in Assamese

COLLEGE FEES STRUCTURE

COLLEGE UNIFORM

- ❑ For girls - Pink coloured Kurta and white salwar (trousers) with white dupatta or pink coloured blouse and white mekhela chadar with pink border.
- ❑ White Coloured Labcoat/ Apron is Compulsory for Students having Practicals.

For P.G. Students.:

- ❑ For boys - White coloured shirt and Black coloured trousers
- ❑ For girls - White coloured Kurta and white salwar with Pink dupatta .

COLLEGE IDENTITY CARD

New Identity cards are issued to the fresh students. Old Identity Cards are to be surrendered at the end of each academic session. For renewal of Identity Card an additional amount will be charged. Students are advised to keep the college Identity Card with them during college hours.

ADMISSION AND ATTENDANCE

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- ❖ Application for admission into the college will be through online mode.
- ❖ Please follow the detailed instructions for uploading relevant documents while applying for admission specified in the admission web page.
- ❖ Admission into the college is strictly made on merit basis and is governed by the college admission rules. The Principal's decision is final in this regard.
- ❖ Reservation of seats is as per Govt. rule.
- ❖ A few seats are reserved for students having Extra-curricular activities in the field of sports, culture and NCC.
- ❖ HS and Degree students who have failed may also apply for admission along with the fresh applicants. However no extra preference will be given to them.

ATTENDANCE RULE

- ❖ Students having less than 75% class attendance will not be allowed to fill up forms of HS 1st year and Final examination.
- ❖ Degree students must have 75% of class attendance in order to fill up forms of Final examination of Gauhati University.
- ❖ For allotting Internal Assessment marks in Degree examination, at least 75% attendance of the total number of classes held is necessary.
- ❖ Regular attendance in classes will give extra weightage to the internal marks.

CREDIT & GRADING : As per G.U. guidelines. The guidelines are available in every department

GENERAL RULES FOR MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE

- ❖ The students admitted to the college must abide by all the rules and regulations as prescribed by the college authority. Violations of the rules, unsatisfactory progress, irregular attendance, irregular clearance of college fees, showing discourtesy to the teachers and staff members in any form, adoption of unfair means during examination etc. are some of the offences which will lead to disciplinary action.
- ❖ Every student must carry their 'Identity Card' inside the campus, which must be produced for verification when demanded by the authority.
- ❖ Every student must wear the college uniform inside the college campus.
- ❖ Prior permission of the authority is necessary to represent the college at outside forums.
- ❖ Use of cellular phone is strictly prohibited inside the classroom during class & examination hours.
- ❖ Students should keep college campus clean. Spitting, smoking, disfiguring the walls etc. are strictly prohibited. Any student found guilty of doing so shall be subject to expulsion from the college.
- ❖ All forms of ragging inside the college campus is strictly prohibited.
- ❖ Consumption of gutkha, sikhar and other alcoholic or narcotic drugs in the college campus is strictly prohibited.
- ❖ All powers of maintenance of discipline are vested with the Principal. In all cases, the decision of the Principal shall be final and binding.



EXAMINATION RULES AND EVALUATION PROCESS

Examination Rules (General)

The authority strictly adheres to the College Examination and Promotion rules. There will be a unit test examination for HS 1st and 2nd year students and in addition, a test examination for HS 2nd year students. From the Session 2022-23 class test will be conducted in every 15 days for H.S. classes It is compulsory for all students. There will be a sessional examination for the degree courses on the dates prescribed in the academic calendar of the college. Based on this, students will be allowed to fill up the forms of final examinations held by AHSEC/ Gauhati University. Students unable to appear in a test on medical grounds must submit application along with medical certificates prior to the test. Under no circumstances, medical certificates will be entertained in more than one test.

Examination Rules and Evaluation of TDC under Semester System

- In case of any dispute regarding evaluation or unforeseen events, the matter may be placed in the Committee of Courses and Studies (U.G.) for amicable settlement. Since the semesters involve continuous assessment, there shall be no scope for a student to appear as a system, the existing University Rules and the Gauhati University Act 1949 (as amended till date) shall be applicable.
- The rules of examination and evaluation of degree students are as per the examination and evaluation rules of Gauhati University, which is available at the official website of Gauhati University and B.B.K. College.
- All Final Examinations will be held as per AHSEC and Gauhati University routine.

STUDENT MENTORSHIP

The mentorship relationship between a teacher and student expands beyond teaching to advancement in the educational and personal growth of the student. So Mentorship facility is introduced in our Institution.

REGARDING ANTI-RAGGING

As per the UGC Guideline [No. F 1-16/2007 (CPP-II), April, 2009], all forms of ragging in hostels and the college campus are prohibited. Clause 3.4 of the above mentioned regulation defines “Ragging” as :

Any conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other student, indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities which cause or likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student or asking the students to do any act or perform something which such student will not in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student.

Ragging is considered as a cognizable offence under the law of the land and ragging in all its forms is totally banned in the entire institution, including its departments, constituent units, all its premises (academic, residential, sports, canteen etc.) whether located within the campus or outside and in all means of transportation of students whether public or private.

Punishable ingredients of Ragging are (1) Abetment of ragging (2) Criminal conspiracy to rag (3) Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging (4) Public nuisance created during ragging (5) Violation of decency and morals through ragging (6) Injury to body, causing hurt or grievous hurt; (7) Wrongful restraint (8) Wrongful confinement (9) Use of criminal force (10) Assault as well as sexual offences or unnatural offences (11) Extortion (12) Criminal trespass (13) Offences against property (14) Criminal intimidation (15) Physical or psychological humiliation (16) All other offences following from the definition of 'Ragging' (17) Attempts to commit any or all of the above mentioned offences against the victim(s).

The College Authority has set up an empowered 'Anti-Ragging Committee'. Under mentioned disciplinary actions may be taken if any student is found to be involved directly or indirectly in ragging:

1. Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges
2. Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/ fellowship and other benefits
3. Debarring from appearing in any test/ examination or other evaluation process
4. Withholding of results.
5. Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival etc.
6. Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.
7. Cancellation of admission.
8. Rustication from the institution for period ranging from 1 to 2 years.
9. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.
10. Fine ranging between 2 5,000/- and 1,00,000/-.
11. Collective punishment : When the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified the authority will resort to collective punishment.

In the event of any complaint regarding ragging no one can plead ignorance to be excused from punitive action.

STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES

HOSTEL FACILITY

The College has hostel facilities for both boys and girls. The seats are allotted strictly on merit basis. Some seats are reserved for the remote area commuters and SC/ST/OBC students. To avail hostel facility, students will have to apply separately.

Hostel Fees (for both Boys & Girls) : As per Govt. guidelines.

CANTEEN

The college has a canteen to supply food in reasonable price during working hours.

XEROX FACILITY

Xerox facility is available in the college. Every student can avail this facility by paying Rs. 2/- (Rupees two) per copy.

EXCURSION :

The college organizes excursion annually. To promote awareness of global and comprehensive understanding of educational scenario, Special Educational Tours are organized by the college. These are undertaken during the autumn recess.

The students for Tour are generally selected strictly on merit and medical fitness. The number of students for the excursion will be limited to 24, of which two will be ex-officio members of the Students' Union.

Educational Tour During Autumn Recess : Educational tour is arranged separately by respective departments and hostel during autumn recess.

The College has an excellent Library and Information Centre, one of the institution's central support services. The library has been carefully designed to provide a comfortable seating and reading environment with proper light and air-conditioners. It's a spacious premise comprising an area of 2795 Sq feet. The library has the capacity of sitting more than 70 readers in total with the provision of separate reading rooms for students and teachers. There is also a dedicated digital room with 6 computers for accessing e-documents & internet in the library and a beautifully designed periodical section with group a discussion table.

The library has a boasting collection of more than 16000 physical books, more than 1000 magazines, journals, and other resources. Currently, the library is subscribing to one peer-reviewed journal in physical format and 3 Newspapers. The library is subscribing to N-List & NDL services & also building an institutional repository for digital books.

The Library is automated using KOHA software. All the issue return processes are operated through the software using barcode printed ID Card. The library has its own OPAC for catalogue searching, online Attendance system and a dedicated webpage. To enhance security, the library is equipped with CCTV system.

The library provides reprographic services to the students. The library has two server computers and other two normal PCs, which are currently being processed to be sent for repair as after the flood they are found to be not working properly. As part of the automation and digitization, the library has a tabletop scanner for the digitization process. The library has a normal inkjet printer and a barcode printer and a scanner for the automation purpose.

DEPARTMENTAL LIBRARY:

Each department has rich collection of textual and reference books on the subject concerned. Students may borrow books from the departmental library subject to the procedure and rules of the department concerned.
